ATTORNEYS AGAINST HUNGER SUPPORTED AGENCIES

EACH OF THE FOLLOWING AGENCIES RECEIVE A PORTION OF THE PROCEEDS FROM THE ANNUAL CAMPAIGN:

DOWNTOWN MINISTERIUM WALK-IN MINISTRY

The Downtown Ministerium Walk-in Ministry is a collaboration of five downtown churches: First Lutheran Church, First Presbyterian Church, Smithfield United Church, St. Mary of Mercy Parish, and Trinity Episcopal Cathedral. Each of these churches provides hunger assistance to the homeless and less fortunate downtown.

EAST END COOPERATIVE MINISTRY



The hunger services provided by East End Cooperative Ministry (EECM) include a food pantry and soup kitchen located at East Liberty Presbyterian Church. The food pantry serves those in Pittsburgh's East End Communities. EECM's Soup Kitchen serves hot, nutritious lunches to all visitors Monday through Friday. EECM also runs a Meals-on-Wheels program for frail and homebound residents.

GREATER PITTSBURGH COMMUNITY FOOD BANK



The Greater Pittsburgh Community Food Bank works with a network of over 380 member agencies located throughout an eleven-county region of southwestern Pennsylvania. Member agencies include smaller county-wide food banks, food pantries, soup kitchens and daycare centers. For over 25 years, the Food Bank has served urban and rural populations, working, retired, and clients of all ages and economic backgrounds.

HUNGER SERVICES URBAN LEAGUE OF PITTSBURGH



The Hunger Services Department of the Urban League offers an Emergency Food Assistance Program which refers individuals and families to one of over 300 pantries in the network. In emergency cases, food is provided from an onsite pantry along with food vouchers. This program also offers an annual Thanksgiving Distribution with pre-packed bags of holiday food for clients to prepare.

INTERSECTION, INC.



The Intersection's on-site meal program provides a light breakfast and hot midday meal to people who are hungry and do not have a permanent residence or accessibility to adequate kitchen facilities. The food pantry club provides food orders to income-eligible McKeesport residents with children.

JUBILEE KITCHEN



Jubilee Kitchen provides a hot noonday meal 365 days a year to individuals challenged by poverty, illness, joblessness, or homelessness. Jubilee Pantry has purchased the building where the pantry has been located since 1981 and is renovating the building in order to expand services in its Polish Hill location.

JUST HARVEST



Just Harvest conducts public policy advocacy at all levels of government for the funding of hunger and poverty-related programs. Just Harvest also provides community education, empowerment, and outreach in the areas of hunger and poverty.

PITTSBURGH AIDS TASK FORCE



The food pantry of the Pittsburgh AIDS Task Force provides assistance to individuals living with HIV/AIDS. The Food Pantry program, PATF's most requested service, provides food, nutritional supplements, and nutritional counseling.

RAINBOW KITCHEN



Rainbow Kitchen's Anti-Hunger Programs provide a source of nutritious supplemental food for low-income individuals and families. The Breakfast Program provides a substantial, nutritious hot meal each weekday morning, serving an average of 70 people per day. The Food Pantry provides a 3-5 day supply of supplemental groceries to an average of 110 low-income households each month. In addition, the Rainbow Kitchen provides hunger services to local elderly and disabled clients, as well as children at an after school program.

SQUIRREL HILL COMMUNITY FOOD PANTRY



The Squirrel Hill Community Food Pantry serves the needs of those in the 15217 zip code as well as the greater Pittsburgh area and offers non-perishables, fresh produce, meat or poultry, personal hygiene products as well as a full pantry of kosher food products. They also offer emergency food assistance in crisis situations.

NEW GRANT RECIPIENTS IN 2011:

NORTH HILLS COMMUNITY OUTREACH



The North Hills Community Outreach (NHCO) offers hunger services to families and individuals in northern Allegheny County at three locations: Millvale, Alison Park and the North Boroughs. NHCO operates two food pantries that help over 1,200 clients annually.

SOUTH HILLS INTERFAITH MINISTRIES



South Hills Interfaith Ministries (SHIM) serves the southern Allegheny County communities of Baldwin-Whitehall, Bethel Park, Keystone Oaks, Mt. Lebanon, South Park, and Upper St. Clair. In September 2010, SHIM's Food Pantry served 350 families (or over 1,000 individuals). The pantry operates on Thursday and Friday, bi-monthly, and allows families to shop through and choose their own food products.
