Thanks to a second grant from the PA Department of Community & Economic Development, the ACBF is now in its fourth year of providing financial stipends to public service attorneys. This year, the PILFP Committee awarded \$24,600 to nineteen attorneys who have shown exemplary performance and commitment in their fields of law. PILFP was launched in 2009 in an effort to financially assist public service attorneys to enable them to stay in their chosen profession.

This year, the ACBF provided \$39,500 in loans & scholarships to deserving law school and high school students. The awards are established by a variety of named funds administered by the Foundation and require each student to meet criteria depending on the fund's purpose.
